Feedback Analysis Report (2023-24)

Sri Guru Teg Bahadur Khalsa College, Sri Anandpur Sahib has designed mechanism to collect feedback from its stake holders such as Students, Teachers, Parents, Employer and Alumni through online Google form for the Academic Session 2023-2024. Student feedback about Curriculum increases their satisfaction level.

Feedback is an important part of the learning cycle, and student learning outcome is linked to institutional effectiveness. A reliable feedback system can support institutions in collecting and understanding information for faculty development portfolios. Unlike other assessment methods feedback allows students to take an active role in their learning. The feedback analysis is a mechanism to check the effectiveness of teaching learning process along with administrative activities taking place in the institute. From analysis, the strengths and weaknesses can be traced and remedial measures can be taken to improve the working of Institute. It also enables a teacher to see how teaching practice can be improved, and which teaching and learning strategies are more likely to be effective. Structured and Unstructured feedbacks are conducted to assess the satisfaction of various stakeholders concerning syllabus and its outcome. We value feedback and treat it with highest respect, courtesy, value and confidentiality.

Feedback from final year under-graduate and post-graduate students was collected. The feedback was collected from students through structured Performa on curriculum, teaching learning process, evaluation process, infrastructure facilities etc.

Suggestions from former students have proved to be highly beneficial for the Institute. During Parent Teacher Association meeting, parents provide valuable suggestion for improving Teaching, Administration the Library and infrastructure facilities Teachers provide valuable inputs on how to improve the curriculum teaching Facilities and the institute's collaboration with them.





The Feedback is obtained from all Stake Holders including students, parents, teachers, alumni and employers as shown in Fig 1.





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
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Student Feedback (2023-24)

To ensure quality of education among students, a feedback a conducted at the end of each semester on two Questionnaires comprising of 30 different parameters, which are analyzed and utilized for generating various kind of facilities to the students. Each variable has been evaluated on the scale of 8, where 7-8 stand for 'Excellent' and 1-2 stands for 'Average'. The feedback in the form of Google Form was taken from students and on an average more 600 responses were obtained for each criterion.

Curriculum Feedback (Parameters VS Percentage)









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1. **Course Content:** The feedback on course content shows a generally positive sentiment, with 42% rating it as excellent and 39% as very good. This suggests that the majority of respondents are satisfied with the comprehensiveness and relevance of the course content, indicating effective curriculum design and delivery.

- 2. **Extent of Course Objective Achieved:** Respondents' feedback on the extent of course objectives achieved is positive, with 30% rating it as excellent and 46% as very good. This indicates that the majority perceive the course as effectively meeting its objectives, contributing to their learning outcomes.
- 3. **Learning Value (Knowledge, Concepts, Skills, Perspective):** The feedback on learning value is positive, with 38% rating it as excellent and 38% as very good. This suggests that the majority of respondents find the course valuable in terms of gaining knowledge, concepts, and skills, contributing to broadening perspectives.
- 4. **Clarity and Relevance of Syllabus:** Feedback regarding the clarity and relevance of the syllabus is positive, with 38% rating it as excellent and 38% as very good. This indicates that the majority perceive the syllabus as effectively communicated and aligned with their learning needs and expectations.
- 5. **Relevance of Additional Source Material (Library, e-Resources, Journals):** The feedback on the relevance of additional source material is positive, with 33% rating it as excellent and 37% as very good. This suggests that the majority find the supplementary resources valuable in enhancing their learning experience.
- 6. **Availability & Utility of Reading/Reference Material:** Feedback on the availability and utility of reading/reference material is positive, with 32% rating it as excellent and 41% as very good. This indicates that the majority perceive the reading/reference material as readily available and beneficial for their studies.





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7. **Overall Rating:** The overall rating reflects high satisfaction levels, with 41% rating it as excellent and 35% as very good. This indicates that the majority of respondents are highly satisfied with the course overall, highlighting its effectiveness in meeting their educational needs and expectations.

Conclusion: The feedback indicates a positive perception of the course content, learning value, syllabus clarity, relevance of additional source material, availability/utilization of reading material, and overall satisfaction with the course. However, there are areas for improvement, particularly in enhancing syllabus clarity and ensuring even better availability and utility of reading/reference material.




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Examination Feedback (Parameters VS Percentage)



1. Results of Examination are declared within one month of its conduction: The majority of respondents (45%) strongly agree that examination results are declared within one month of its conduction, indicating satisfaction with the promptness of result announcements. Additionally, 36% agree with this statement, suggesting overall positive sentiment towards the timeliness of result declaration. However, a small proportion (5%) disagrees, implying some dissatisfaction with the delay in result announcements.





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- 2. The attitude of examination staff towards the students is helpful: Respondents' feedback regarding the attitude of examination staff towards students shows a positive trend, with 39% strongly agreeing and 41% agreeing that the staff's attitude is helpful. This indicates that a significant majority perceive the examination staff's behavior favorably. Only a small percentage (6%) disagrees, suggesting that there may be room for improvement in certain instances.
- 3. Paper Evaluation/Marking process is fair and transparent: The feedback regarding the fairness and transparency of the paper evaluation/marketing process is mixed but generally positive. While 39% strongly agree and 40% agree that the process is fair and transparent, a notable proportion (6%) disagrees. This suggests that while the majority perceives the evaluation process positively, there are still some concerns about fairness and transparency that need to be addressed.
- 4. Question papers are set in accordance with instructions given in the syllabus: A significant majority of respondents (45%) strongly agree that question papers are set in accordance with instructions given in the syllabus, indicating satisfaction with the alignment between the syllabus and examination content. Additionally, 41% agree with this statement, further supporting the positive perception of question paper setting. Only a small percentage (4%) disagrees, suggesting that the majority find the question papers well-structured and aligned with the syllabus.
- 5. Invigilation protocols during examination are strictly followed: The feedback on the strict adherence to invigilation protocols during examinations is generally positive, with 50% strongly agreeing and 38% agreeing that the protocols are strictly followed. This suggests that the majority perceive a high level of vigilance and adherence to examination procedures. A very small percentage (3%) disagrees, indicating overall satisfaction with the invigilation process.



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Conclusion: The feedback indicates a generally positive perception of the examination processes, including result declaration timeliness, the attitude of examination staff, fairness and transparency of evaluation, alignment of question papers with the syllabus, and adherence to invigilation protocols. However, there are areas, such as the fairness of evaluation and transparency of the paper evaluation process, where improvements may be needed to address concerns raised by a minority of respondents.




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Institutional Facilities Feedback (Parameters VS Percentage)



1. Class and Laboratory Facilities: The feedback regarding class and laboratory facilities is generally positive, with 36% of respondents rating it as excellent and 34% as very good. This suggests satisfaction with the quality and availability of facilities for academic activities. While there are some who rated it as good or average, indicating room for improvement, the overall perception of class and laboratory facilities is positive.





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2. Library Facilities: Respondents' feedback on library facilities shows a mixed but generally positive sentiment, with 32% rating it as excellent and 36% as very good. This suggests overall satisfaction with the resources and services provided by the library. However, there are still some who rated it as good or average, indicating areas where enhancements could be made to further improve library facilities.

- 3. Parking Facilities: The feedback regarding parking facilities is somewhat lower compared to other parameters, with 32% rating it as excellent and 30% as very good. This suggests that while a significant portion perceives the parking facilities positively, there are some concerns about its adequacy or convenience. There is room for improvement, as a notable percentage rated it as good or average.
- 4. Hostel Facilities (Only for girls): Feedback on hostel facilities for girls indicates moderate satisfaction, with 31% rating it as excellent and 28% as very good. This suggests that while some aspects of hostel facilities meet expectations, there may be room for improvement in certain areas. Additionally, a notable percentage rated it as good or average, indicating areas where enhancements could be made.
- 5. Canteen Facilities: The feedback on canteen facilities shows a mixed sentiment, with 28% rating it as excellent and 30% as very good. 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7. While some aspects of ICT facilities meet expectations, there may be room for improvement in certain areas. Additionally, a notable percentage rated it as good or average, indicating areas where enhancements could be made.
- **9. Security Facilities:** Feedback on security facilities is generally positive, with 39% rating it as excellent and 35% as very good. This suggests satisfaction with the security measures in place. However, there are areas for improvement, as indicated by the percentage rating it as good or average.
- 10. Career Counseling and Placement Facilities: The feedback on career counseling and placement facilities shows moderate satisfaction, with 34% rating it as excellent and 37% as very good. This suggests that while some aspects of career counseling and placement services meet expectations, there may be room for improvement in certain areas. Additionally, a notable percentage rated it as good or average.
- 11. Wi-Fi Facilities: Feedback on Wi-Fi facilities indicates moderate satisfaction, with 26% rating it as excellent and 26% as very good. This suggests that while some aspects of Wi-Fi facilities meet expectations, there may be room for improvement in certain areas. Additionally, a notable percentage rated it as good or average.





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Conclusion The overall feedback reflects moderate to high satisfaction across different facilities and services, with the majority rating them as excellent or very good. However, there are areas for improvement, as indicated by the percentage rating them as good or average. This suggests that enhancements may be needed to meet the expectations of all participants and further improve overall satisfaction levels.




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Library Facilities Feedback (Parameters VS Percentage)



- 1. Arrangement of Books in library is in proper order: The majority of respondents (44%) strongly agree that the arrangement of books in the library is in proper order, indicating satisfaction with the organization and accessibility of library resources. Additionally, 41% agree with this statement, further supporting the positive perception of the library's arrangement. Only a small proportion (2%) disagrees, suggesting overall satisfaction with the organization of books.
- 2. Reading space is available for reading books: Feedback regarding the availability of reading space for books shows a positive trend, with 39% strongly agreeing and 44% agreeing that reading space is available. This indicates that a significant majority perceive the library as providing adequate space for reading. A small portion (3%) disagrees, suggesting that there may be room for improvement in ensuring sufficient reading areas.





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3. The approach of library staff towards students is cooperative & helpful: Respondents' feedback regarding the approach of library staff towards students indicates mixed but generally positive sentiment. While 35% strongly agree and 41% agree that the staff's approach is cooperative and helpful, a smaller proportion (6%) disagrees. This suggests that while the majority perceives the library staff's behavior favorably, there are some concerns about the cooperative and helpfulness of the staff that need to be addressed.

4. E-resource facility is available for use: The feedback on the availability of e-resource facilities for use is generally positive, with 35% strongly agreeing and 47% agreeing that the facility is available. This suggests that the majority perceive the availability of e-resources as satisfactory. A smaller proportion (3%) disagrees, indicating overall satisfaction with the availability of electronic resources.

Conclusion: The feedback indicates a generally positive perception of the library facilities and services, including the arrangement of books, availability of reading space, cooperative approach of library staff, and availability of e-resource facilities. However, there are areas, such as the approach of library staff and availability of reading space, where improvements may be needed to address concerns raised by a minority of respondents.




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Teachers Performance Feedback (Parameters VS Percentage)

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
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Parents Feedback (2023-24)

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

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

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

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

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

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

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

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

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

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
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Alumni Feedback (2023-24)

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

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
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Teachers Feedback (2023-24)




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Above chart shows that 53.3% of teachers strongly feel that the given syllabus content can be covered in a stipulated time effectively and 44.8% agree with the statement.









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

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

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

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
Practical exposure helps the brain retain learned information for a long time. Above chart shows that 97.2% of teachers of our college are happy with the practical exposure in the syllabus.

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
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OVERALL TEACHERS' FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM

- For parameter 3 (The teachers are allowed to go for training/FDP/Refresher course/Workshop etc) 97.1% of responses are in scale of 4 and more.





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
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Employers Feedback (2023-24)







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It is observed that more than 50% employers agree that the syllabus fulfills the essential requirements.








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Employability skills tend to be non technical skills that help in making an impactful employee. It is observed that more than 65% employers are agree that the syllabus makes the student employable.






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The above chart reveals that 74.1% employer's feel that the syllabus makes the students more innovative.








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The above chart shows that 70.3% employers feel that the syllabus content is designed on par with industrial requirements and makes students more competitive enough.




The above chart shows that 74.1 % employers feel that the syllabus content transfer effective knowledge and skills to students.



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




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OVERALL EMPLOYERS' FEEDBACK ON CURRICULUM



The obtained feedback indicates that a good percentage of responses have received strongly agree/or agree rating on all the parameters i.e., the rating of 4 and more.






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- For parameter 1 (The syllabus is revised regularly) 70.3% of responses are in scale of 4 and more.

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The Employers were largely satisfied with the students' performance. They suggested for providing additional inputs to subject knowledge in the form of skill development and practical exposure to industry. Though employers were largely satisfied with the students' performance they also suggested for making efforts to improve English Communication skills of students. However, they had some suggestions such as holding training programmes for grooming of students, study of market demand to incorporate courses into the curriculum. Necessary steps have been taken to take care of this.
